

Curriculum Intent- Music

“We use opportunities to explore and learn”-Music communicates on many different levels. Use of appropriate vocabulary in music will ensure children develop a deeper understanding of the subject. Performance of Music in choir and assemblies supports the development of high expectations of behaviour and interaction and encourages the children to take pride in producing high-quality pieces of work.

“ never overlooking the needs of other”-in music children will look at the reasons behind the composition of music that they listen to, the messages that the music sends , including the messages from lyrics of songs. They will look at issues that arise from the use of music in society in general. They will discuss these within the context of catholic social teaching, and where relevant what responses they feel are appropriate

“ we recognise that each one of us is special “- As pupils are introduced to a wide range of musical styles and traditions, it is of high importance that they are encouraged to appreciate and celebrate the differences. It also helps them develop a sense of tolerance and respect for others through developing their understanding of differing cultures.
