BRITISH VALUES in the EYFS

Democracy

Circle time is used to promote sharing and taking turns. Listening to others is also encouraged and listening to different opinions. Children vote on group decisions, for example which songs and stories are used in the curriculum. Children work together to solve puzzles, build with construction toys and share ideas.

Rule of Law

The children learn about Guy Fawkes and the history of Bonfire Night. Classroom rules are established with the children to promote school values and during the topic 'People who help us' the children are visited by the police who explain to them how rules keep everyone safe in the wider community.

Individual Liberty

Through Continuous Provision children choose which activities they access and choose if they would like to access these indoors or outdoors. The children self-register every morning and show their emotions on the 'feelings board'. They learn all about themselves in 'All about me' and their own history and who they are.

Mutual Respect

Lots of activities and project days promote respect such as Remembrance Day where a 2 minutes' silence is held, Harvest and other religious festivals promote mutual respect and displays in the classroom that promote different types of family. Children discuss home experiences in school to share similarities and differences. In Reception, children learn different greetings from around the world.

Acceptance of those of different faiths and beliefs

Traditions, faiths and cultures are celebrated at St. Veronica's and a wide range of religions are covered in the EYFS including Diwali, Eid, Christmas and many more. Each class has a prayer area that helps promote spirituality and the opportunity to reflect on their own and others faiths.
