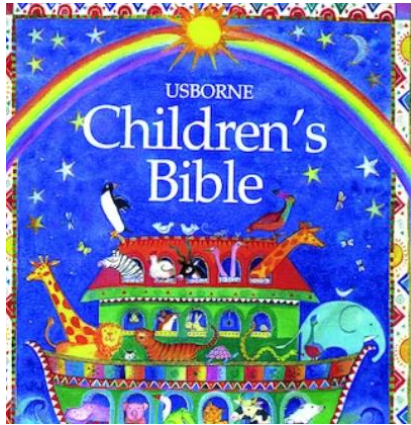
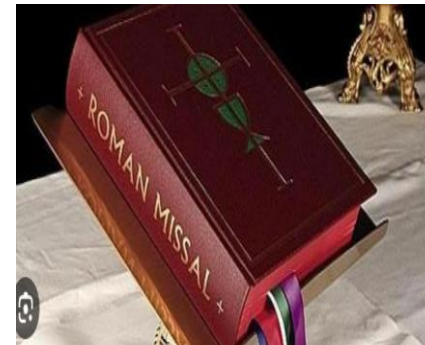

	respect	a feeling of deep admiration for someone or something						
	Scripture	the sacred <u>writings</u> of Christianity contained in the Bible.						
	lectern	a tall stand with a <u>sloping</u> top to hold a book or notes, from which someone, typically a <u>preacher</u> or <u>lecturer</u> , can read while standing up						
	Gospel	the teaching or <u>revelation</u> of Christ.						
	Bible	the Christian <u>scriptures</u> , consisting of the Old and New Testaments.						
	New Testament	the second part of the Christian Bible, recording the life and <u>teachings</u> of Christ and his earliest followers. It includes the four Gospels, the Acts of the Apostles, <u>twenty-one</u> Epistles by St Paul and others, and the book of Revelation.						
	Old Testament	the first part of the Christian Bible, comprising thirty-nine books and corresponding approximately to the Hebrew Bible. Most of the books were written in Hebrew, some in Aramaic, between about 1200 and 100 BC.						
	genre	a style or category of art, music, or literature.						
thurible	thurible is a metal censer in which incense is burned during religious services.							
missal	a book containing the texts used in the Catholic Mass throughout the year.
