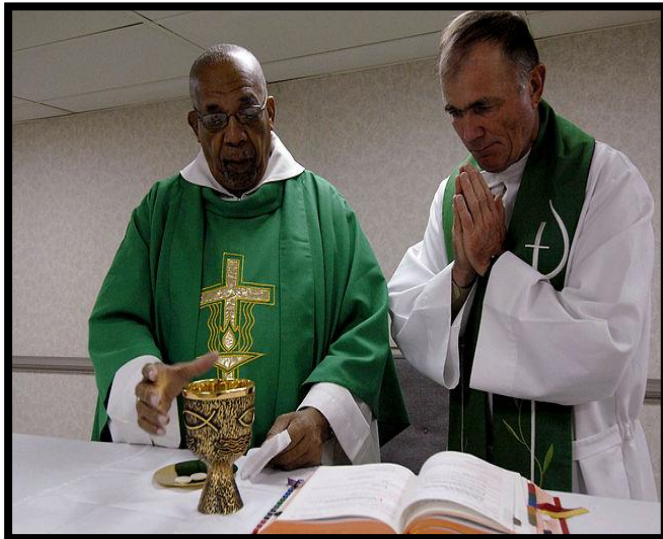
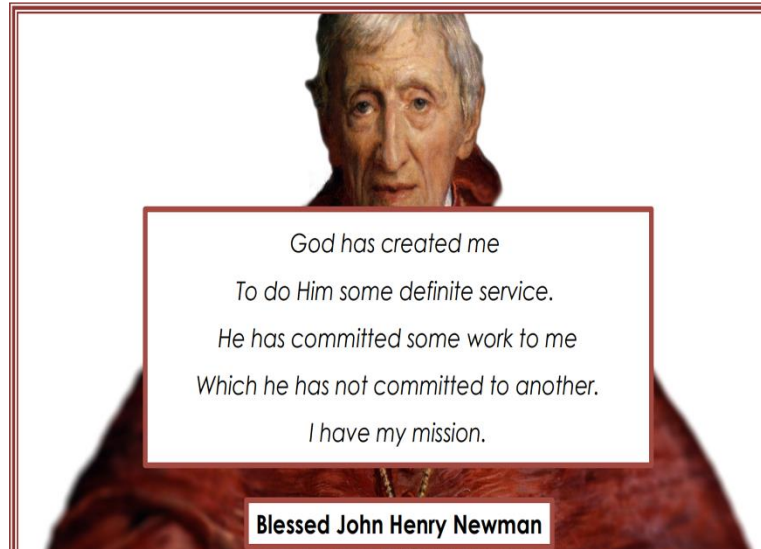

When you make friends, you have to think about the other person and show respect and loyalty towards them. • In order to be a good friend, we have to be committed to loving one another, as Jesus loved us. • In the sacrament of Baptism, Christians are called to share the mission of Jesus. • There are many different ways of carrying out a 'mission' such as becoming a Priest or Nun. • That Blessed John Henry Newman was a Priest who had a special mission, as he helped to feed poor Irish families, Spread the word of the Lord and dedicated his life to God. • That fidelity is significant within Marriage, as it is all about being loyal to one another and keeping promises. • The promises in Marriage: to have and to hold, for better, for worse, for richer, for poorer, in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish and until death do us part. • Order of Marriage: Hymns, opening prayers, gospel reading, exchanging vows, consent, blessing of the rings bidding prayers, the Our Father, Nuptial Blessing, signing of the register and final blessing.
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
