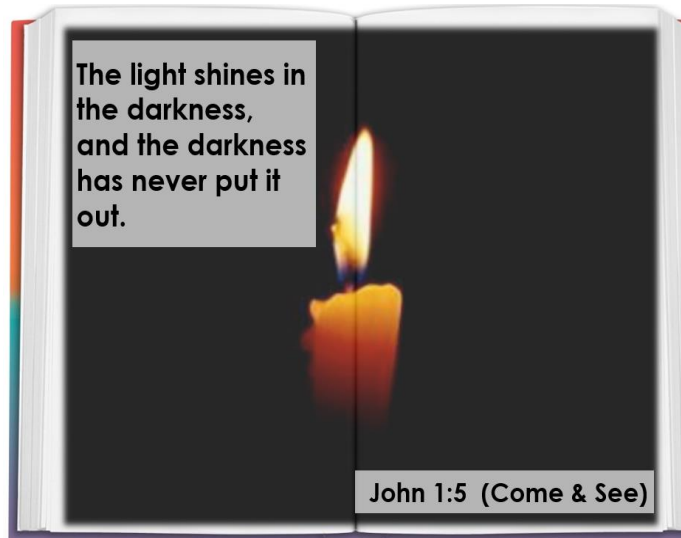
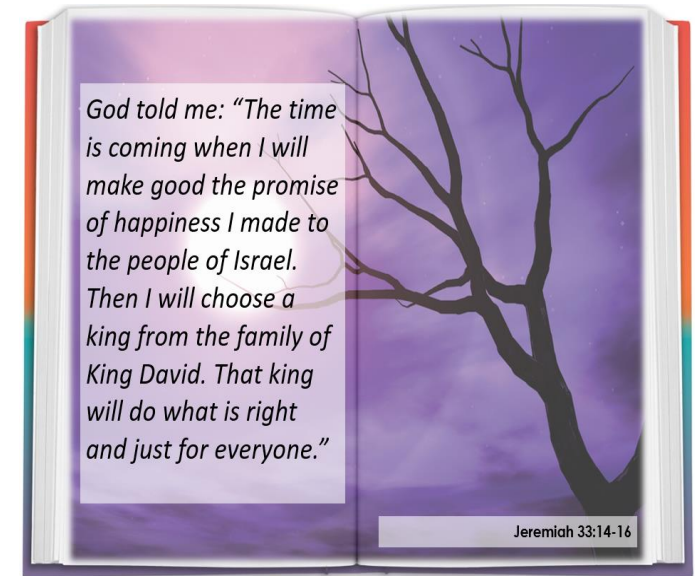

Links to the Bible: Psalm 27: 13-14, I Samuel 16: 4-13 (God's Story 3 page 35) Isaiah 9: 2-3, 6-7, Isaiah 25: 8-9, Isaiah 40: 9-11 (Church's Story 3 page 88) Jeremiah 33:14-16, John 1: 5 Matthew 1:1-17 (God's Story 3 page 69) Matthew 1:18-25, Mark 13:33 Luke 1: 38-57, James 5: 7-8	At the end of the topic, I will know that: - That Isaiah was a very important prophet who was born about 765 years before Jesus. - Isaiah said that the Messiah will wipe away the tears from everyone's eyes and take away the disgrace his people have suffered throughout the world. - That Advent is a time for waiting in joyful hope for the coming of Jesus at Christmas as the people of God were waiting for the Messiah. - The purple candles in particular symbolize the prayer, penance and good works undertaken at this time. - The rose candle is lit on the third Sunday, Gaudete Sunday, this a time of rejoicing, because this is the midpoint of Advent. - The white candle and light signifies Christ, the Light of the world. - The Annunciation: when the angel Gabriel asked Mary to be the Mother of Jesus. - The psalm says that 'I believe that I shall see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living.' We can see this through Mary because of her great courage and strength as she took on the role of Jesus' mother.
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
