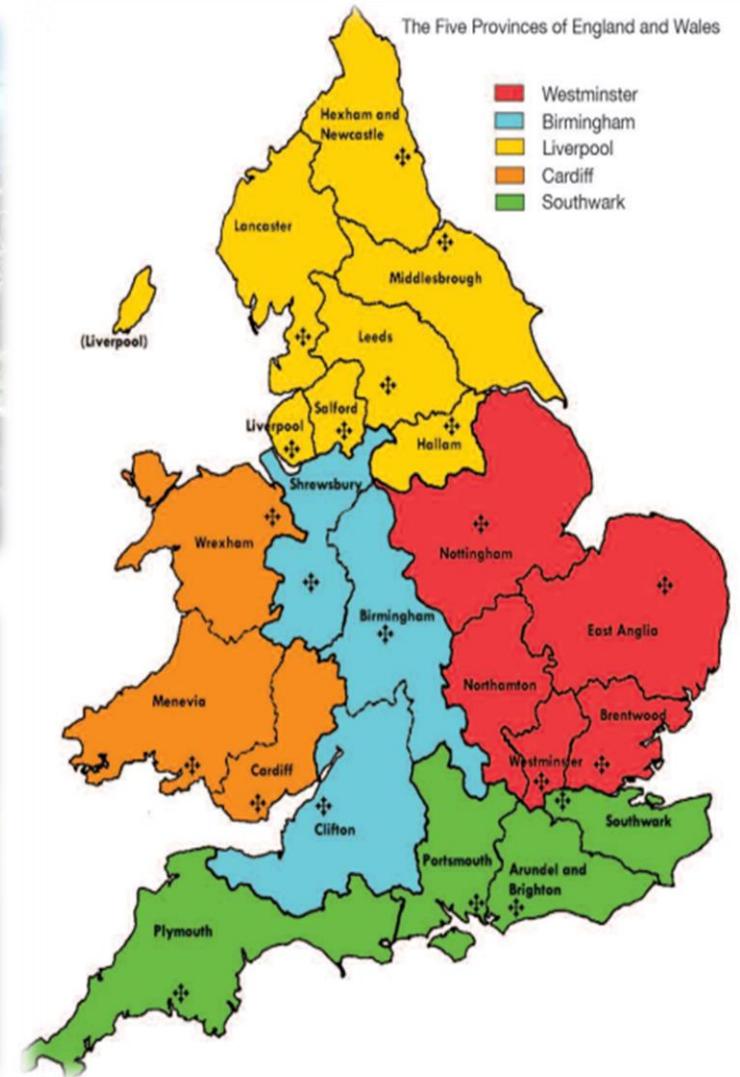
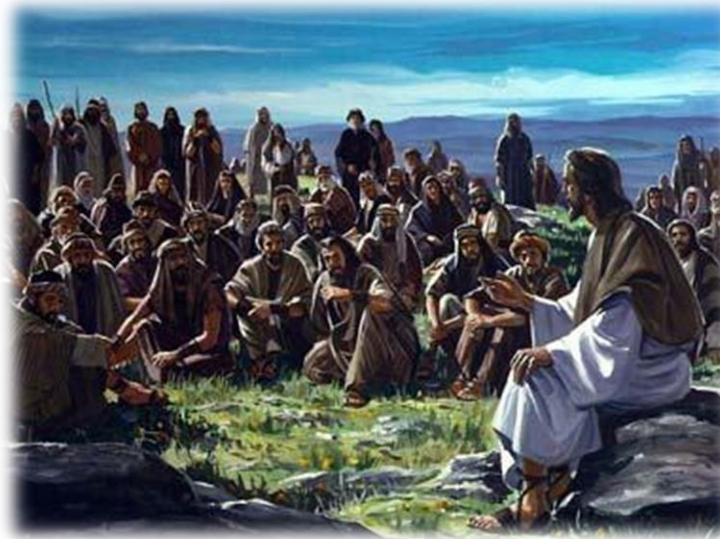
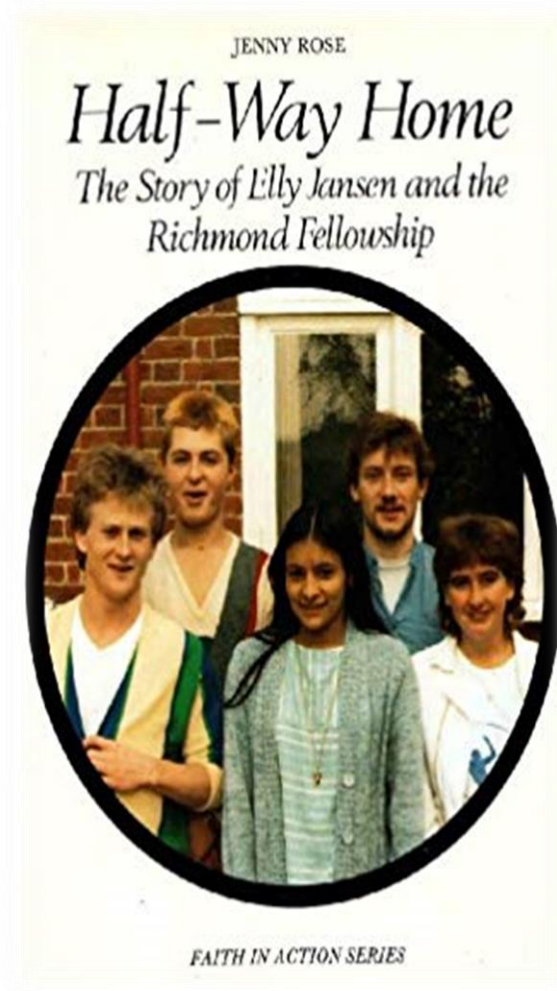

	Community	a group of people living in the same place or having a particular characteristic in common such as sharing the same beliefs.	
	Diocese	A district under the pastoral care of a bishop in the Christian Church. Inside each diocese are a number of parishes. Each parish is the area supervised by a local priest, and is part of the diocese.	
	Commitment	Being dedicated to fulfil a promise.

	Vocation	A strong feeling that you are especially suited to do a particular job or to fulfil a particular role in life, especially one which involves helping other people.	
	Bishop	He is chosen and appointed by the Pope. The role of the bishop is to preach the Gospel, that is the Good News, to everyone and to be a witness to its truth. Bishops are the successors of the apostles and continue Jesus' mission as leaders of the Church today.	
	Baptism	This is a sacrament of belonging and welcoming into the Catholic Church.	
	Ecumenism	The principle or aim of promoting unity among the world's Christian Churches

He chose twelve people to be his apostles and share his mission • Caritas is an organization inspired by the Gospels, the teachings of the catholic church and the hopes of people living in poverty. They encourage people to respond to causes of poverty and violence. • Parish families form part of larger Christian communities called Dioceses. • The role of the bishop is to preach the Gospel, that is the Good News, to everyone and to be a witness to its truth.
