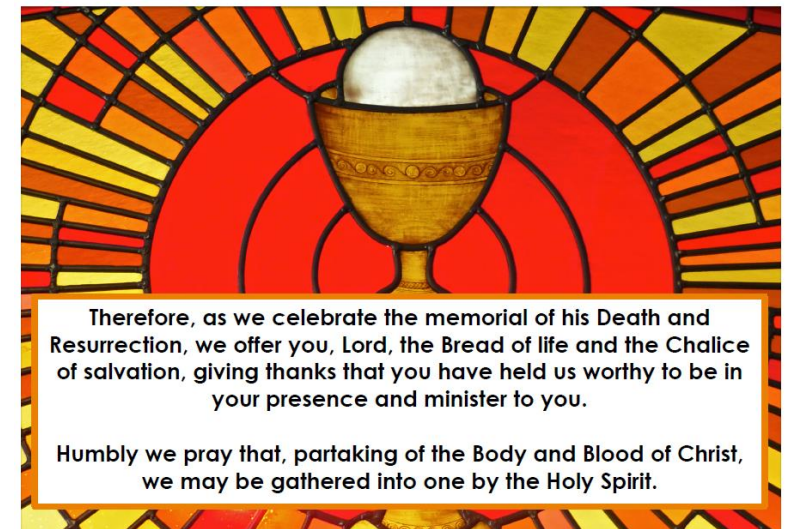
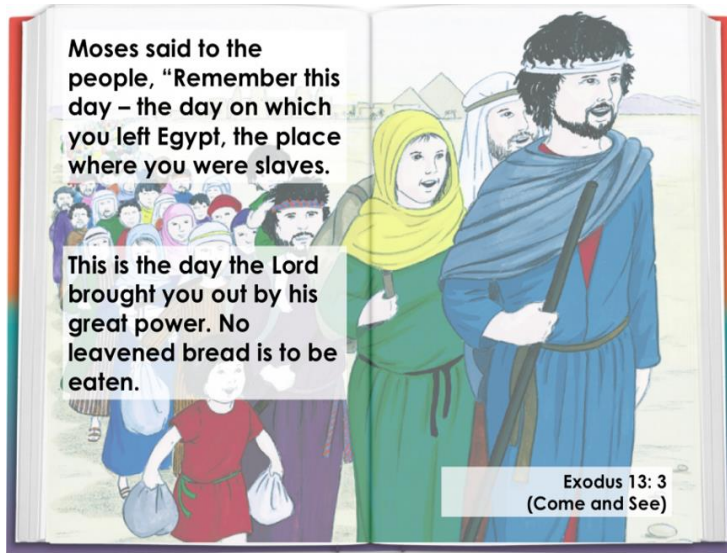

	Sacrifice	To give up something that is valuable to you in order to help another person.	
	Passover	A major Jewish festival which celebrates the liberation of the Israelites from Egyptian slavery.

	Host	A portion of bread used for Holy Communion in many Christian churches.	
	Eucharistic Prayer	The prayer that will change the bread and wine into the body and blood of our Lord.	
	Consecration	The action of declaring bread and wine to be, or represent, the body and blood of Christ.	
	Holy Communion	A remembrance of the last supper focusing on the moments before Jesus was arrested and taken off to be crucified

	Adoration	An opportunity for the faithful to pray to Jesus Christ before the Eucharist at their local parish

Links to the Bible: Exodus 13: 3 Luke 22: 14-20		At the end of the topic, I will know that: • That memories strengthen our sense of identity and purpose and bond our relationships. • Passover is a celebration of the story of Exodus. During Passover, Jews remember how their ancestor’s left slavery behind them when they were led out of Egypt by Moses • Passover (or Pesach in Hebrew) is one of the most important festivals in the Jewish year. • On the evening before Passover starts, Jews have a special service called a Seder (Order). This takes place over a meal with family and friends at home. • The Last Supper is an important event in the life of Jesus Christ where he shared a final meal with his disciples before his arrest. The bread and wine point to the body and blood of Christ to be sacrificed for our salvation on the cross. • Every time the Eucharist is celebrated, Christians are keeping the memory of Jesus alive. The Eucharist is a memorial of Christ’s sacrifice on the Cross and makes that present and real. • In the Eucharistic prayer, the priest holds the host and says the words: Take this, all of you, and eat of it: ‘for this is my body which will be given up for you.’ • These are called the words of consecration. Consecration means made holy. • The ‘Mystery of Faith’ is the opportunity for the people to say out loud what they believe.
