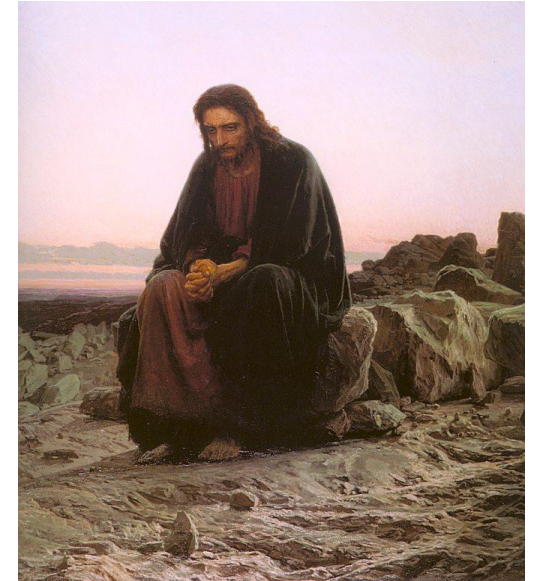
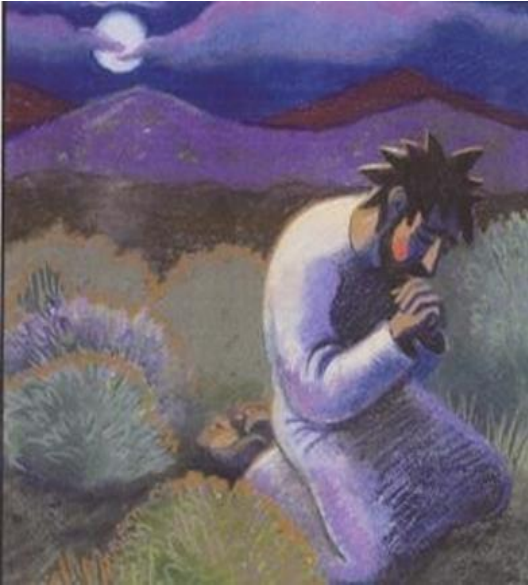

Links to other topics: PSHE –Valuing difference and Rights and Respect	Lent	Lent is a 40-day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It is a season of penitence and preparation	
	Holy Week	The week before Easter, starting on Palm Sunday. It is a time when Catholics gather to remember and participate in the Passion of Jesus Christ.	
	Maundy Thursday	Holy Thursday is the commemoration of the Last Supper of Jesus Christ, when he established the sacrament of Holy Communion prior to his arrest and crucifixion.	
	Altar of repose	An altar where the Communion host, consecrated on Maundy Thursday, is placed.	
	Gethsemane	The place where Jesus and his disciples prayed before his crucifixion

	Crucifixion	An ancient form of execution in which a person was nailed or bound to a cross.

During this time, he was tempted by the devil. • Lent is a season of reflection and preparation before the celebrations of Easter. By observing the 40 days of Lent, Christians replicate Jesus Christ’s sacrifice and withdrawal into the desert for 40 days. Lent is marked by fasting, both from food and festivities. • On Ash Wednesday, we think about the sins of the previous year and say sorry for them. In hope Jesus will forgive our sins. • During an Ash Wednesday service, we are marked with a cross of ashes on our foreheads. • Judas was one of those chosen by Jesus to be his follower; he was tempted by the chief priests with silver coins to betray Jesus. • On Maundy Thursday, Jesus commanded us to “...love one another, as I have loved you,” he showed his love through his service – the washing of the feet - and he commands us to do the same • In the Garden of Gethsemane, Jesus Christ underwent the agony in the garden and was arrested before his crucifixion. • Jesus was crucified on Good Friday alongside two robbers; the crucifixion was a crucial moment in his life as this act brought humans salvation from sin. • After the crucifixion, Jesus’ body was buried in a tomb guarded by Roman soldiers. Early on the Sunday morning, three days after the crucifixion, some of Jesus’ female followers went to anoint his body with spices. However, the tomb was empty.
